TOWER 1 3RD FLOOR ELEVATOR LANDING UPDATE:

Good Evening. We reported last week that we were recoating the 3rd floor east elevator landing deck, requiring it to be closed between Sunday and today. However, after checking on it this afternoon, it is not quite cured enough to open. We are going to leave it close to allow it to fully cure and prevent carts from doing possible damage to the new coating. We will reopen the landing tomorrow, Wednesday, November 3rd. Again, we apologize for any inconvenience this may cause.

Tower 1 - 3rd Floor Elevator Landing Closure:

Beginning Sunday, October 31st at 12:00 p.m. we will have to close the Tower 1, 3rd floor east end elevator landing in order to recoat the deck in this heavy traffic area. This will also mean that accessing Tower 1 from the pedestrian bridge will also be closed. During this time, guest staying in Tower 1 will be permitted to load and unload in front of Tower 1 on the ground floor. For those who are simply parked in the garage and need to get to Tower 1, it is advisable to cross the street using the Tower 2 bridge, take the elevator to the ground floor and then over to Tower 1. While you will be able to cross the street using the pedestrian crosswalk, the route across the Tower 2 bridge will help you avoid having to cross traffic.

It is important to note that the elevators on this east end will still be operational to all floors except the 3rd floor. If you are staying on the 3rd floor, you will need to use the west end elevators. At no point will access in front of any of the units on the 3rd floor be

closed. We will have guards available to help direct folks in the right direction. Again, we apologize for any inconvenience this may cause. We expect to reopen this area on Tuesday morning.



New Elevator Buttons:

Earlier this year we announced that the Association would be replacing the elevator cab buttons, as well as the landing call buttons on each floor. The current gel-back buttons, as you have probably experienced, wear out quickly and can lead to the button not working at all. The new buttons will be LED hard-back buttons that should prevent this from happening as frequently, if at all.

Beginning Monday, November 1st, Kone Elevators will swap the button control boards and landing call button floors. They will work on one elevator at a time. Additionally, they will be adding position indicators to the elevator ground floor and 3rd floor elevator lobbies.
